

Thanksgiving over the Water

Presider We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing

them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

At the following words, the Presider dips the foot of the Paschal Candle in the water

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. **Amen**.

Presentation and Examination of the Candidates

Answer I do.

Question Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Answer I do.

Question Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

Answer I do.

After all have been presented, the Presider addresses the congregation, saying

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support this person in his life in Christ?

People We will.

The Presider then says

Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ, and renew our own baptismal covenant.

The Baptism

The candidates are presented by name to the Presider, who then pours water upon each candidate, saying Declan, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen**.

Then the Presider places a hand on each person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross [using Chrism if desired] and saying

Declan, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. **Amen**.

Jonah, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen**.

Then the Presider places a hand on each person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross [using Chrism if desired] and saying

Jonah, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. **Amen**.

When this action has been completed, the Presider, at a place in full sight of the congregation, prays over the newly baptized, saying

Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon these your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them inquiring and discerning hearts, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen**.

The Presider then says

Let us welcome the newly baptized:





Sanctify us + also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **AMEN**.





Epiphany 1A January 8, 2023 Isaiah 42:1-9; Psalm 29; Acts 10:34-43; Matthew 3:13-17

The season of Epiphany is when we celebrate the revealing of Christ to the world. We mark the arrival of the One who is the light of the world: a light that brings life, a light that brings hope. This light shines its brightest when

we are in community - with God and with one another. The Office of Global Partnerships of The Episcopal Church invites individuals, small groups, congregations, and dioceses to use our weekly video series throughout the season of Epiphany to draw closer to each other and our Lord.

Using an adaptation of *lectio divina* with the gospel passage for each Sunday, you'll meet and hear from Episcopal missionaries who have served around the world as they read and reflect on Jesus' revelation to us. Missionary service through The Episcopal Church is accomplished through the Young Adult Service Corps (for Episcopalians aged 21-30) and Episcopal Volunteers in Mission (for Episcopalians over the age of 30). Learn more about these programs at *iam.ec/yasc* and *iam.ec/evim* respectively.

This week's *lectio divina* features Mary Higbee, Jim Higbee, the Rev. Ranjit Mathews, and the Rev. Amanda Akes-Cardwell. Watch their discussion at <u>iam.ec/epiphany2023</u> and follow along by yourself or in a small group. To participate:

1. Read today's Gospel passage:

Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptized by him. John would have prevented him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" But Jesus answered him, "Let it be so now; for it is proper for us in this way to fulfill all righteousness." Then he consented. And when Jesus had been baptized, just as he came up from the water, suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." (Matthew 3:13-17, NRSV)

2. Reflect:

Which word or short phrase caught your attention or came to mind? Whether you're alone or in a group, say it aloud.

3. Read:

Reread the passage, perhaps in a different translation.

4. Reflect:

Where does the passage touch your life today? If you're with a group, share your responses with each other, without discussing further. If you're alone, say your response aloud or write it down.

5. Read:


Reread the passage, perhaps in yet another translation.

6. Reflect:

Where is God calling you to go? Where, either near or far, can you cross boundaries, listen deeply, and live like Jesus? You might consider journaling out your response and meditating on it over the course of this week.

7. Pray:

In closing, say the Collect for Epiphany 1 in the Book of Common Prayer (p. 214).



Creating Space for Christ and the Neighbor

Episcopal Migration Ministries has resettled more than 100,000 refugees and asylum seekers, helping them to find a home and find hope.

I still remember my very first diocesan convention as a new Episcopalian. It was in Cherry Hill, New Jersey, and the Episcopal Diocese of New Jersey had welcomed Presiding Bishop Michael Curry to speak. He invited the entire convention to take off our shoes, just as Moses did in front of the burning bush. Then, he wove a beautiful story about the people of Israel and their journey out of slavery into the promised land.

Bishop Curry spoke of the challenges and the frustrations, the people's fear, and the struggle to choose faith over certainty. It was in that moment that I realized I was in the right church for

me. Eventually, I pursued ordination and now have the pleasure of serving at Episcopal Migration Ministries.

As churches begin planning for the upcoming year, we journey through Advent, my favorite liturgical season. In this season, we wait with expectant hope for our Savior. I am mindful that for countless migrants throughout the world, this posture of waiting is not simply a practice of faith, but is rather the ground of their hope for survival and for a place to call home.

We at EMM seek to facilitate that homecoming, having recently celebrated the resettlement of the 100,000th refugee through our programs. This past year has seen the expansion of the Neighbor-to-Neighbor program, working to connect congregations to serve as community sponsors for asylum seekers. It also saw our team mobilize after the previous presidential administration decimated the refugee resettlement infrastructure, rising to the challenge to welcome thousands of Afghans fleeing their country as the Taliban took control of Afghanistan.

It is in times like these, when we see our faith put into action, that I remember Presiding Bishop Michael Curry's message—that this work is holy, and creating home is a sacred task. So may we create space in our lives for Christ; and may we create space in our homes, our congregations, and our communities to welcome newcomers. I can think of no better way to mark Advent.


