Prelude and Procession to the Crèche


Candles are lit for the congregation before the hymn begins.



All remaining standing as they are able, the Presider says

Blessed be God: + Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

People And blessed be God's kingdom, now and for ever. Amen.

The Presider says

Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.



Collect of the Day

Almighty God, you have given your only-begotten Son to take our nature upon him, and to be born this day of a pure virgin: Grant that we, who have been born again and made your children by adoption and grace, may daily be renewed by your Holy Spirit; through our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom with you and the same Spirit be honor and glory, now and for ever. *Amen*.

Dear People of God: In this Christmas Season, let it be our care and delight to hear once more the message of the Angels, to go to Bethlehem, and see the Son of God lying in a manger. Let us hear and heed in Holy Scripture the story of the loving purposes of God, and of the glorious redemption brought to us by the holy Child Jesus. And let us make this place glad with our carols of praise.

Holy Gospel Luke 2:1-20

Gospeller The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and

wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over

their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David, a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"



When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

Presider Let us affirm the faith of the Church using the words of the Nicene Creed:

We believe in one God,
the Father, the Almighty,
maker of heaven and earth,
of all that is, seen and unseen.
We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,
the only Son of God,
eternally begotten of the Father,
God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God,
begotten, not made,
of one Being with the Father;
through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate: he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Intercessor That the Prince of Peace may guide the leaders of the nations, and all women and men everywhere, into the ways of freedom and truth. Let us pray; **Lord**, **hear our prayer**.

Silence is kept.

For Justin, Archbishop of Canterbury; Sean, Presiding Bishop of our Church; and Bonnie, our Bishop, that they may guide us in our journey to Bethlehem, uniting the whole Church as we live into our spiritual kinship with one another. Let us pray; *Lord*, *hear our prayer*.

Silence is kept.

For those for whom dark times have suffocated hope: the lonely, the fearful, the hungry, and those who bear a private grief; that they may see the dawn of God's love, and revive the eternal hope that never fades away. Let us pray; *Lord*, *hear our prayer*.

Silence is kept.

For our families and friends, and for all our absent siblings; for those who are sick or troubled, [especially ______and those you may now name]; and for those who have died, and who now feast at the heavenly banquet of God's grace [remembering especially _____and those you may now name]. Let us pray; *Lord, hear our prayer*.

That we may be released from the captivity of our sins, the places of interior blindness that cause us to choose darkness over light; that we may be forgiven by the power of the Holy Spirit. Let us pray; *Lord*, *hear our prayer*.

That we who gather to share the Holy Eucharist, and those throughout the world who come to receive the sacrament of Holy Presence, may bear witness to Christ, born in our hearts. Let us pray; *Lord*, *hear our prayer*.

Presider O God, you have caused this holy night to shine with the brightness of the true Light: Grant that we, who have known the mystery of that Light on earth, may also enjoy him perfectly in heaven; where with you and the Holy Spirit he lives and reigns, one God, in glory everlasting. *Amen*.

Confession of Sin

All kneel as they are able.

The Presider says

Since we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need. *Hebrews 4:14,16*

A Minister then says

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

Silence is kept.

Minister and People

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

A Priest stands and says

Almighty God have mercy on you, + forgive you all your sins through the grace of Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. *Amen*.

Peace

All stand as they are able.

Presider The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People And also with you.

The Ministers and the People may offer God's peace to one another in the name of the Lord.

Holy Communion

The Presider says

Walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself for us, an offering and sacrifice to God. *Ephesians* 5:2

The People then are seated.

Representatives of the congregation bring the people's offerings of bread and wine, and money or other gifts to the Presider.

The people stand as they are able when the offerings are presented and placed on the Altar.


Almighty God, you shape your very life to create and restore and enjoy us forever.


We gather around your altar, like those who thronged your Son's manger, longing for you to reassemble men and women, rulers and working people, Jews and Gentiles, heaven and earth, at the place where our humanity and your divinity meet.

As his arms were bound in swaddling clothes, so later his hands were nailed to the cross; yet you made his birth the foretaste of our redemption and his death the gateway to resurrection life.

The Presider continues

God of new birth, as you laid your Son in Mary's arms, you place these gifts of bread and wine in our hands.

Sanctify your church + to be as fragile and tender and true as the infant Savior.

Send down your Holy Spirit, + that this bread, of wheat gathered from the fields, and this cup of wine, of grapes gathered from the vineyards, may be for us the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ.

On the night before he died for us,
Jesus was at table with his friends.
He took bread, gave thanks to you,
broke it, and gave it to them, and said:
"Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you.
Do this for the remembrance of me."

As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine. Again, he gave thanks to you, gave it to them, and said: "Drink this, all of you:
This is my Blood of the new Covenant,
which is poured out for you and for all
for the forgiveness of sins.
Whenever you drink it,
do this for the remembrance of me."

Great is the mystery of faith.

Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again.

The Presider continues

God who exalts the humble, and humbles the exalted, as you drew the magi to the place of your epiphany, call us to yourself, and bring your creation to its consummation.

Lift your whole church, living and departed, to the vision of your glory, once made flesh in a humble family, now exalted and reigning with justice and mercy.

In this banquet restore us in your image, surround us with your company, and prepare us for your freedom, after the pattern of your Son, through whom and with whom and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory are yours, now and forever. *AMEN*.

And may the blessing of God Almighty, + the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be among you, and remain with you always. *Amen*.


