⁷Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God. ⁸For I tell you that Christ has become a servant of the circumcised on behalf of the truth of God in order that he might confirm the promises given to the patriarchs, ⁹and in order that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. Matthew 3:1-12

¹In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming, ²"Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." ³This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said,

"The voice of one crying out in the wilderness:

'Prepare the way of the Lord,

make his paths straight.'"

⁴Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. ⁵Then the people of Jerusalem and all Judea were going out to him, and all the region along the Jordan, ⁶and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins.

⁷But when he saw many Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? ⁸Bear fruit worthy of repentance. ⁹Do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our ancestor'; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. ¹⁰Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.

powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you

with the Holy Spirit and fire. ¹²His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and will gather his wheat into the granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

Nicene Creed

Presider Let us affirm the faith of the Church using the words of the Nicene Creed.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father [and the Son], who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead. and the life of the world to come. Amen.

O Lord of Might, who gives sight to the blind and opens the ears of those who cannot hear, who heals the sick, raises the dead, and brings good news to the poor, give us a share of your power that we may do the works you do; let us pray; **O come**, **O come**, **Emmanuel**.

Silence is kept.

O Branch of Jesse's tree, we give thanks for our spiritual ancestors, by whose faith the lamp of truth illumines the disciples of every age; let us pray; **O come**, **O come**, **Emmanuel**.

Silence is kept.

In thanksgiving for programs and people who assist those troubled with alcoholism, gambling, and any addiction that holds our souls in bondage; for those who are generous in their giving for the mission of the Church: its ministry and witness, its temporal responsibilities and spiritual treasures, let us pray; **O come, O come, Emmanuel.**

Silence is kept.

As a people ever-watchful for the coming of the Messiah, let us continue our intercessions. We give you thanks for [______ and] all the blessings of this life.. We pray for the sick, and for those in any need or trouble [especially_____]. We pray for those who have died [especially _____].

Silence is kept.

Presider O Root of Jesse's stem, sign of God's love for all his people: come to save us without delay! Make us watchful and keep us faithful, O Lord our God, as we await the coming of your Son our Lord; that, when he shall appear, he may not find us sleeping in sin but active in his service and joyful in his praise; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Holy are you, God of Jesse, for the branch of our salvation is rooted in you.

To Abraham you promised to raise up a people bound to you in love, and through the household of David you brought life greater than our imagining in a child of grace, Jesus our Lord.

Though we deny your love for ourselves and seek to limit the reach of your mercy to others, you beckon us to repentance, open our eyes to new life, and embrace us to join your family of faith. In your Son's death we see the depth of our sin; yet in his resurrection we see the extent of your grace. You bless us beyond reckoning, for you welcome us into the company of prophets and apostles and saints on earth and in heaven, with whom forever we proclaim your praise.



Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

The Presider continues

Anointing God, your Spirit rested upon your Son with wisdom and understanding, counsel and might, knowledge and fear. In Christ you have anointed your future out of our past, your kingdom out of our plans, and your salvation out of our poverty. As your Spirit rested upon him, send down that same anointing Spirit upon these gifts of bread and wine, that they may be for us the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ; who, at supper with his disciples, took bread,

gave you thanks, broke the bread, and gave it to them, saying, "Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup.

Again he gave you thanks, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Presider and People

Great is the mystery of faith. Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

The Presider continues; the People pray the text in **Bold Font**.

Astonishing God, your prophet Isaiah envisioned a day when the wolf and lamb would lie down together, and the leopard with the kid, **and a little child would lead them.** Astonish us anew by your gentle ways of peace. **Shape your church to live from faith, not fear.** Make your future present through the lives of those **who show us how to love our enemies.** Hasten the day when the earth will be full of the knowledge of you, **and your fullness will be all in all,** and all creation from the depths of the sea to the heights of the mountains will know the peace to which your Son shall lead. **Awaken that dawn when we are surrounded with everlasting praise to you, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. AMEN.**

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.

Come, and love relentlessly; following Christ on paths of uncertainty, taking risks for one another, calling down unjust power from its throne and lifting up the lowly, the impoverished, the burdened.

Blessed are those, Jesus said, who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.

And so let us come to the table, expectant, eager, open. May we taste the rich blessings of heaven born from unexpected places, and people, and experiences.

God's holy gifts, for God's holy people.
